of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirtie of Jonathan Osborne
of the County of Geage may in the northern Division of his Majesty's
Province of Nova Scotia Governor being very sick and weak in body
But of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore
calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die to make and obtain this my last will
and testament that is to give Principally and first of all I give and
Recommend my soul into the hands of God that give it and for my body
I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent
manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the
Generall Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power
of God and of touching such worldly Estates wherewith it hath pleased
God to Bless me in this life I give devise and Dispose of the same in
the following manner and form

Item I give and bequeath to my wife Anne Osborne wife whom I
like will constitute make & Ordain my only & sole Executor of
this my last will & testament the one third Part of all my
movable Estates & the goods of my house & Land till my said son
be of age and if she Remains a widow longer then she is to have
an equal Hair with them during her widow hood

Item I give & bequeath to my two sons Baptist Osborne and
Nathan Osborne all my Lands to be as Equally divided between them
as it been in Quality & Quantity after my wives widow hood
Item I give to Baptist my Great Bible & the new Book
Item I give Nathan my Gun

Item I give to my son Ananias Osborne the sum of twenty
pounds to be payed out of my Estate when he shall be of age

Item I give to my daughter Abigail Osborne the sum of ten
pounds but if she be dead I give it to my wife

Item I give to my daughter Ruth Osborne the sum of
ten pounds and if there is more then is herein given I give
it to my wife during her life and I do hereby utterly Disallow
Revoke & Disannul all & every other former testaments wills &
Legacies Bequests & Executors by me in any way before this time
made wills & Bequeathed Testifying & Confirming this & no
other to be my last will & testament as witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and
year above written
