

County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey
being of sound mind and memory I hereby
give for it do make and publish this my last
Will and Testament

First I recommend my soul to God that gave it and
my Body to the Grave

Second. I order and direct my Executors herein after
named to pay out of my movable Estate all
my funeral expenses and just Debts as speedily
as possible

Third. I give and bequest to my beloved wife Fanny
the Interest of Twelve Hundred dollars to be paid
to her annually by my Executors the said Twelve
Hundred dollars is mentioned in a Marriage
article between me and my beloved wife Fanny
dated March 17th 1846 which will more fully appear
I also order my Executors out of my Estate to pay
the funeral expenses of my wife if she should sur-
vive me.
