Will  
In the name of God Amen I Thomas Osborne of Chesterfield county  
do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. I give to my  
executors hereafter named the one third of all my Slaves to be <sup>by</sup> them  
held for the use and benefit of my Cousin Martha McCallum for and  
during her life and after her death to go to such person or persons as my  
said Cousin Martha shall think proper to direct by will or deed also my  
Household furniture now in her House. I give to my Cousin Joseph  
Friend my Household furniture, <sup>Mr</sup> McCallum's store with my cloaths  
and Books. I give to my Cousin Nancy Dowd one third of all my  
Slaves and my Household furniture in her House. I give to my Cousin  
Mary Markham my Horse the remainder of my estate after paying my  
debts I give to my Nephew Thomas <sup>Osborne</sup> Taylor to remain in the hands  
of my executors untill he arrives of Lawfull age I appoint George  
Markham Daniel McCallum and Joseph Friend executors of this my  
will In witness whereof I have set my hand <sup>and</sup> seal this 12<sup>th</sup> day of

March one thousand seven hundred and ninety five

being at present in disposed but happily enjoying my perfect senses and recollection and knowing the casualties of life and that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and rendering of none effect all other will or wills by me heretofore made. First It is my will and desire that my body be decently buried and after paying all my just debts and funeral expences I give and bequeath to my grandson George Hancock son of George Hancock Senr. the whole of my Estate both real and personal of every kind this I give to him and his heirs forever. I desire that there should be no inventory taken or appraisement made of my estate. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my said grandson George Hancock Executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eighth of April one thousand seven hundred and ninety two.
